



## **ITALY: THE WONDERLAND**

Let's not forget that Italy is a land of active Volcanoes too, with Etna regularly offering pyrotechnic and spectacular "fireworks" and of thermal waters and springs and therefore, of renowned spas and health and beauty centres to rejuvenate both body and spirit.

Italy is indeed a land of water, apart from its seas and Venice - fragile "lacework" precariously built on its lagoon - we must mention its magnificent lakes. The three major ones of Northern Italy: Lake Maggiore dotted with graceful islands of which Isola Bella is the most famous, Lake Como with its Villas and gardens and Lake Garda, the largest of them all which spans from the Trentino mountains to the Morenic hills of Peschiera and Valeggio, where so many battles to free Italy from its foreign invaders where fought. There are also innumerable less well known lakes all around the country: the enchanting pre-alpine lakes and Lake Orta in the North, Lake Trasimeno in Umbria, Lake Bolsena and Lake Vico in Lazio, just to mention a few.

Italy is not only dramatic sceneries, it is also famous for its gentle, rolling hills, perfect for walking, mushroom picking and cycling, its Medieval hilltop towns and picturesque villages where time seems to have stopped and, on the other hand, modern, busy cities where business, fashion, art, beauty and progress have found a perfect balance. Part of the charm that the visitor to Italy immediately perceives lies precisely in the ability that Italians have to participate fully in the 21st century and at the same time never forget how to enjoy the good things in life, even in busy, business orientated cities like Milan. Not by chance the word "Dolce Vita" was created in Italy!

Last but certainly not least, Art. Better preserved Greek temples than in Greece, unforgettable Roman cities like Pompeii, Etruscan tombs that hunt the imagination, the Museum of Rome, Florence, Venice, Milan, Turin: too many to see in a lifetime and we have mentioned only the main cities. The legacy of numerous civilisations and dynasties, Arabs, Normans, Spaniards, Austrians, the Medici, the Gonzagas, the Farnese, the Este, the Popes and many many others are all still alive in the works of art of these incredible country called Italy.
