

## GALINA VERNIGORA VALE

Galina Vernigora Vale was born in the Ukraine and comes from a family of musicians. She studied at the Moscow Gnesiny Music College while also employed as a principal guitarist with the Kharkoc State Philharmonia from 1986 until 1997. Her repertoire has ranged from orthodox classical guitar to the modern flamenco and East European folk music.

Galina has performed at major festivals including Eurowirral International Guitar Festival, Ripon Music Festival, Hola Mundo and venues such as the Royal Festival Hall, Purcell Room, Kensington Roof Gardens, Leighton House Museum and Bridgewater. She has also starred in three music films produced by the Ukranian State TV. She has recorded several CDs: "The Legend" (1996), "Hungarian Rhapsody" (1999) and "Great Gates of Kiev" (2002). During 2006/07 she has performed in Spain, Italy, Portugal, Turkey, Thailand and South Korea.

Galina now lives in England and continues with her career as a concert performer.
