Legendary Brazilian guitarist Carlos Barbosa-Lima performed at the 35th anniversary of Brazilian Music at the Purcell Room, at the Queen Elizabeth Hall at the Southbank Centre in July. This was a diplomatic and cultural project organised by the Embassy of Brazil in association with LACCS-UK, with the aim of bringing together Brazilian classical and jazz music to the British and international audience.
