Saade-Scaff holds a Master of Music degree from the Catholic University of America in Washington D.C. where he studied with virtuoso Hungarian violinist and renowned pedagogue Robert Gerle. He has been rewarded with special distinctions such as the "Commander of the National Merit Order" given by the President of Ecuador for his work in favour of Ecuadorian Arts and Culture (2002). The Ecuadorian Congress decorated him with the highest cultural award, the "Vicente Rocafuerte Medal for Cultural Merit" (2004). Dr Alfredo Palacio, former President of Ecuador, presented him with the **"National Order to the Official Merit of Ecuador**" (2007), the highest decoration given by the Ecuadorian Government.

Mr Saade-Scaff has performed in concerts around the world. He has served as the Cultural and Press Attaché of the Ecuadorian Embassy in Washington D.C. and Cultural Representative of Ecuador to the Organisation of American States from June 1997 until February 2003. He is currently Professor at the Universidad Espíritu Santo in Guayaquil, Ecuador and Professor Ad-Honorem of violin and viola at the National Conservatoire of Music in Guayaquil and is member of the board of directors of the Guayaquil Symphony Orchestra of Ecuador and the Pan-American Symphony Orchestra in Washington D.C.
